

# Email For Help - Installation

Thank you for your purchase of Email For Help! The installation process is fairly simple and easy, but there are a couple of things that may be slightly different from other installations you have made.

First, I haven't registered this program for certification with Microsoft (for a hefty fee and long delay). That means that when you run the installer, you may get a warning from Microsoft Defender. Microsoft is giving you this warning because Email For Help is an executable file downloaded from the internet, and I haven't given Microsoft the time or dollars for the certificate that tells Microsoft Defender that the program isn't malware. I am very up front about what Email For Help does, and does not do. It does encrypt your email password before it saves it to your computers' registry. It does, at your direction, add a registry entry into the 'run at startup' process so that the program can perform inactivity checking in case your power is lost and restored. It does contact my web server to see if there are updates available. It does use secure transmission protocols for connecting to your email provider and sending emails. It does keep a log file of all major functions it is performing, and errors it encounters. It does not send any of your personal information anywhere.

Saying that – here are the steps to follow to install Email For Help and get it running on your computer . . .

1. Purchase Email For Help from the website '<https://www.emailforhelp.com>' and download the installation file to your computer.
2. When you receive your confirmation email from us (typically 1 to 3 business days), copy either the whole email, or just the registration code, to be entered later.
3. Run the installer program, following the steps detailed below.
4. When complete, a shortcut to Email For Help will be on your desktop, as will a copy of the manual, and setup instructions. Please read the setup instructions and manual, then gather the information you need to enter to configure Email For Help.
5. Configure Email For Help, then start it checking for inactivity.

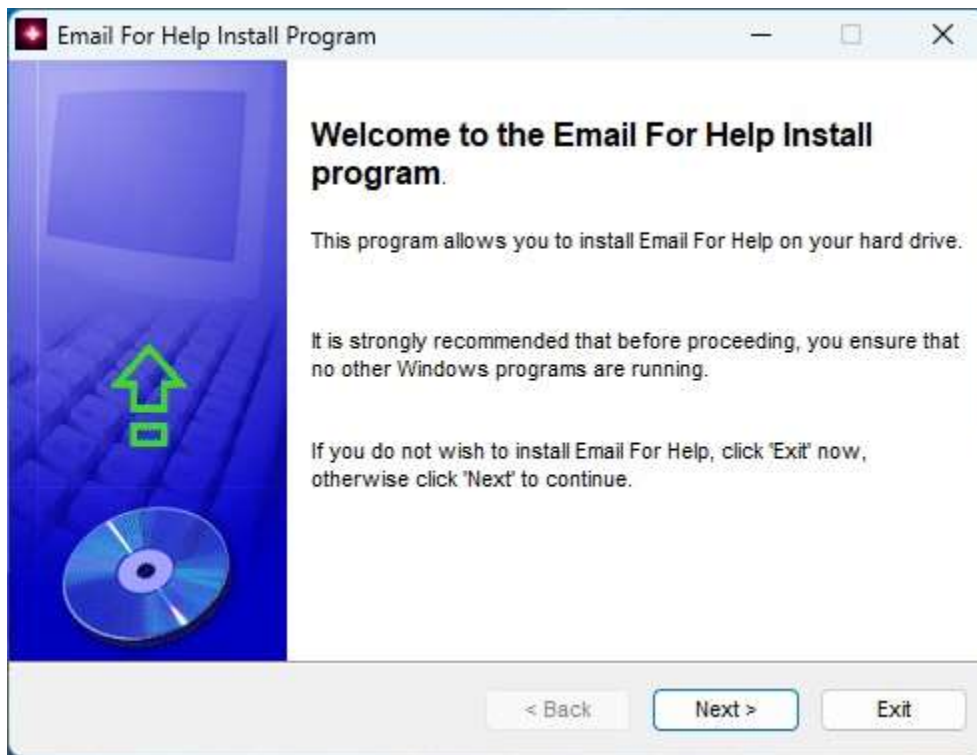
The following two screenshots are what you may encounter when installing Email For Help. You may also get these screens when installing updates. If you do, just click on 'More info' on the first screen ...



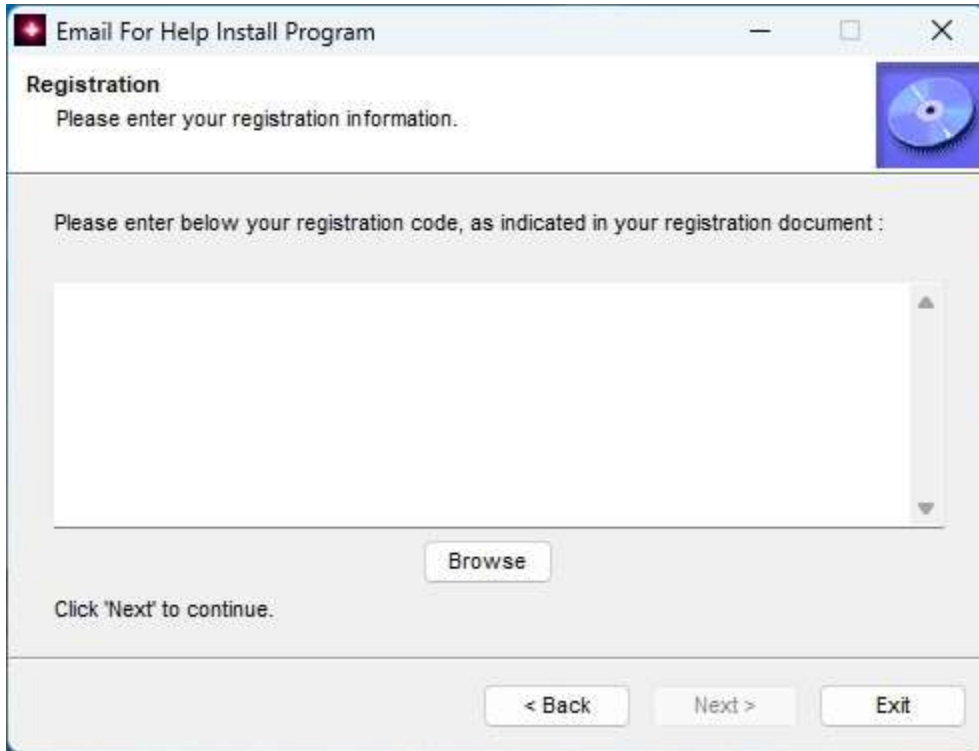
And then click on 'Run Anyway' on the second screen.



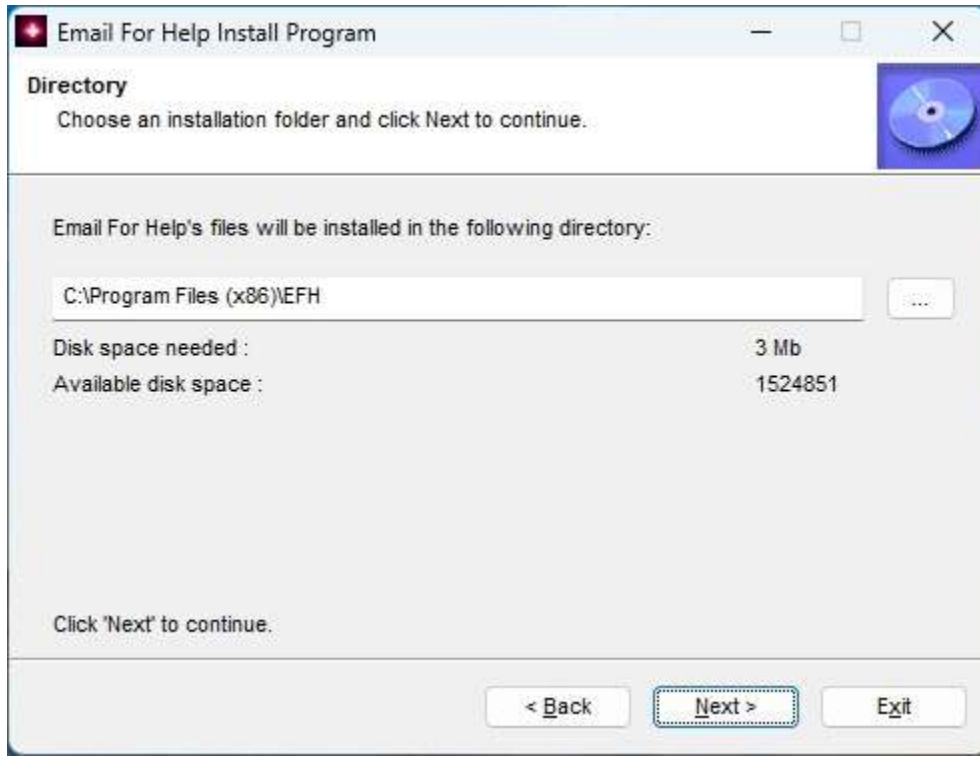
Now the installer will run. When you see the initial screen, click on 'Next' to continue.



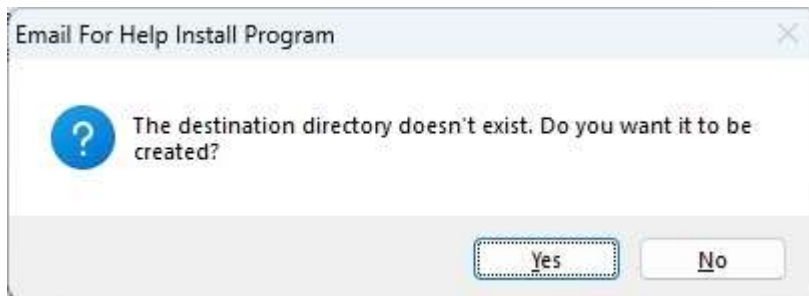
If you have copied the whole email containing your registration code or have just copied your registration code into your clipboard, then it will automatically be entered into this screen. Otherwise, open the email that you received containing your registration code and copy/paste it here. Once it has been entered, the 'Next' button will be enabled. Click on it.



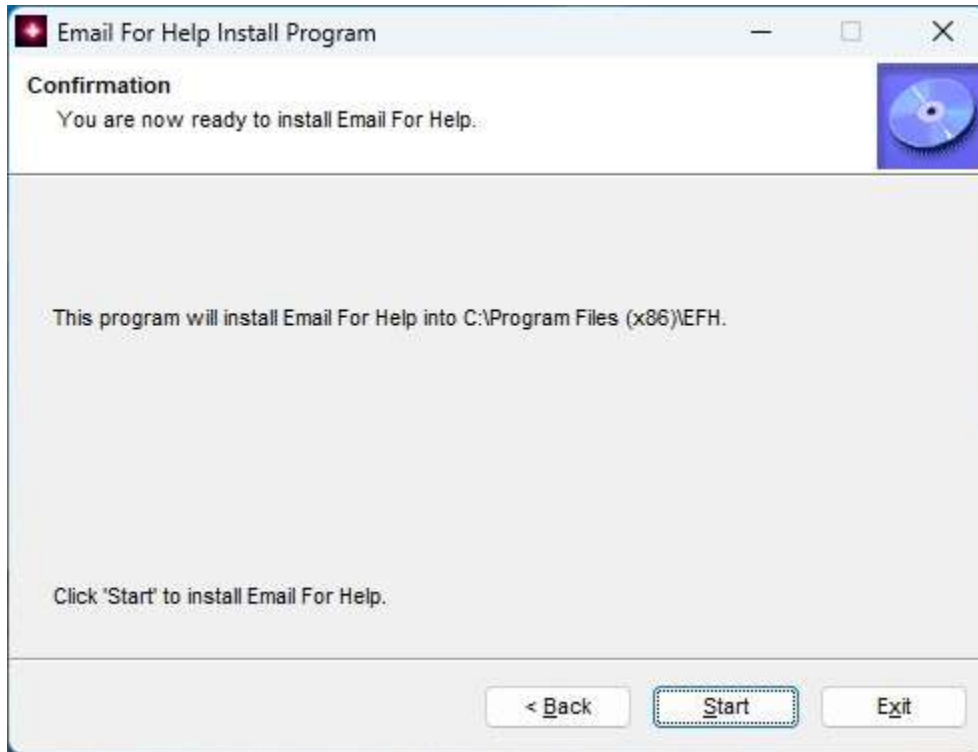
The next screen asks you where to install Email For Help. Select the default (preferred) or enter a location of your choice, and then press 'Next'.



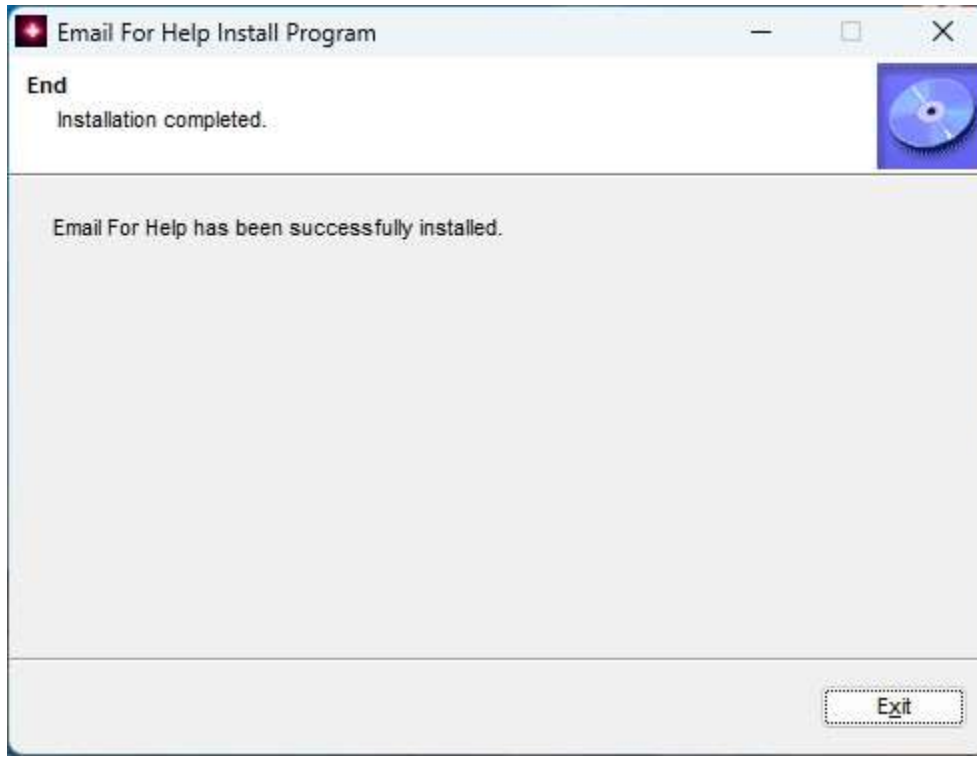
If the installation directory doesn't exist, you will be asked to confirm its creation. Click 'Yes'.



Now click on 'Start' to install Email For Help on your computer.



After Email For Help has been installed, you'll see this screen telling you the installation was successful. Press 'Exit'.



This is when you'll find the Email For Help manual on your desktop, as well as a shortcut to Email For Help. Again, please read the documentation and gather the setup information you need in order to get Email For Help running on your computer!



Please – whenever you bypass Windows Defender protections, scan the file with defender before you run it. To do this, simply right click on the downloaded file, select ‘Show more options’ and then ‘Scan with Microsoft Defender’ ...
